Kia ora, Greetings and welcome

A huge THANK YOU to Jesse for the fabulous Rongoā Maori experience. We made Kumerahou Tea and balm, and Kawakawa Tea and balm. Unfortunately our balms did not set, so we are trying to remedy that. Raewyn-as usual-was a great help with our tamariki during this process. Students had a taste test of the teas this week, and I think some would get sick just to have the Kawakawa tea with apple cider, lemon and honey!

Our garden and orchard area was added to over the weekend with generous donations of orange and mandarin trees from Samantha and her family, and berries which have been espaliered along the wires from Bob and Kaye. Some very welcome additions to our school orchard and much appreciated.

**Talking about gardens**: If you are around in the holidays the student's gardens will need to be weeded as they will be judged this year at AG Day. The juniors are in house groups and the seniors are also in house group plots, but have their own individual gardens. Extra plants can be added if you wish – the gardens are now the student's responsibilities. Worm Tea is available out by the gardens. Dilute on a ratio of 1:10 – one part worm tea and 10 parts water or else it will burn the vegetables. Used correctly it can accelerate growth!

Chicken pox is doing the rounds again at the moment. Chickenpox is contagious from 1–2 days before the blisters appear. Avoid close contact with other people, stay home from work and keep children home from school and early childhood education centres for 1 week from the appearance of the rash until all blisters have dried.

**New School Logo:** Have your say in this. BOT Members have copies or come into the school and we can arrange for you to take a copy home to add your ideas and opinions.
