BOT SPOT:

A great discussion was held regarding the soon to be updated school logo. Janelle has taken on board all the ideas that have been voiced and will draft up two options. These options will be available for viewing on AG Day. A HUGE Thank you to Janelle for her time and patience throughout this process as she takes into account everyone's differing views.

Our school roll is a record high with 37 students. We have grown 75% since 2015. Keep marketing our school and inviting people to come in and talk with Pauline and our staff, look around our classrooms and get a feel for what we have to offer.

The BOT made a decision to reopen the pool. Keys will go on sale soon, after we make changes to the Key holder contract to avoid misuse of the facilities.

Our school is having a fundraiser at Imeson's farm on Sunday 11 November. More details after AG Day.

SWIMMING - The pool is now up and running! Swimming has been optional for this week but will be a requirement from Tuesday next week. Students to please bring in togs and named towels. Also for room 2 please provide named goggles and a swimming cap. If your child is not swimming for the day a note must

be brought from home, or let us know. Swimming is part of our curriculum and with drowning statistics it is important that our students learn confidence In, Under and Around water.

<u>HATS</u> - Hats are now required to be worn, as part of our Health Policy. We are a Sunsmart School. Children are required to wear the red <u>School hats only</u> – all hats are kept at school, each child has their own hat which is numbered. **Hats are NOT shared**.

<u>JUNIOR CAMP</u>- Room 2 camp is to be held 28th / 29th November. This is to be a sleepover at the school with day trips. More details to be provided closer to time.

<u>LIBRARY</u> - Mrs L.K will be in the library on Tuesday's and Thursdays during the second half of lunch break from 1.10 p.m. until 1.30 p.m for students to return or borrow books.

ROOM TWO BOOK BAGS - A reminder that book bags MUST come to school each day – testing is on Friday mornings, if your child's book bag does not come in they can't be tested!
