MEASLES: You may have heard that Dr Nick Chamberlain, Chief Executive of Northland DHB is asking schools to consider excluding unimmunised children during this period of high risk. A letter from Hira Gage, Director of Education Te Tai Tokerau has informed schools that attendance is compulsory between the ages of 6 and 16. Therefore schools are not able to prevent a child from attending school, unless we believe on reasonable grounds that the child has a communicable disease. That we would believe that the child actually had the measles. Measles symptoms to look for include a high fever, runny nose, cough and sore red eyes, followed several days later by a rash starting behind the ears and spreading to the body. Parents and caregivers should seek advice from their GP if you have any concerns.
