Last Friday the staff: Mrs J, Mrs Pye, Mrs Booth, Mrs Grenfell, Ms Macdonald and Whaea Hoana had a very productive day with Te Ahua and Rebecca around Digital Technology and how it will look at Poroti. We have set up new learning programmes for both Junior and Senior classes, after a lot of time spent erasing and resetting devices with appropriate programmes for classroom learning. This will all be explained at our Class meetings in Week 3.

This week we have started Cricket coaching with Matt from Northland Cricket, which will lead up to a Tournament for the Year 4 – 8 students with the other schools in our Community of Learning, on March 24th at Maungakaramea. Alongside that we have Watersafe on Wednesday afternoons. Each class has 4 sessions around safety and survival in the water. This week we learnt with Life Jackets on – how to make a safe entry backwards into the pool, what to do in the water with regards to surviving on our own or in a group. Our Instructor is Louise from Sport Northland . Please ensure that children have their togs and towels. She is teaching our students survival skills in the water, and you never know when they may be in a situation to use them.
