Write That Essay in-class coaching with Jane happened on Wednesday. These coaching clinics are a follow-up to the Teacher Professional Learning workshops. Jane works with our students and teachers around varying aspects of writing. In the Junior class modelling with the Sentence trains, and teaching the older students how to improve their writing and their output (the number of words that they write). In the Senior class modelling a lesson on Generating ideas, Selecting the best, Ranking/ sequencing the ideas ready for paragraphing and then writing supporting sentences to add detail. This is to teach our students, how to plan their writing and how to add detail to their writing. This will also increase their output. All throughout the writing process we look at different sentence types, moving into the different styles of paragraphing .
