Next term our 'School Evaluation Partner' Bill Ahern will come to Poroti to start our journey. ERO are working to design a partnership with us to support our evaluation of what we do at Poroti, and how we can improve that from a teaching and learning and Board perspective. We will work from our Strategic Plan, Strategic Goals, and Annual Plan, looking at our priorities for moving forward. This is a long-term relationship over 3 years, not the previously short, sharp visit of 3 days. We see this as being a positive experience for our school and community. Te Ara Huarau: An ERO evaluation partner will work alongside each school, building a professional evaluation relationship with each school over time. Our evaluation role will connect with each school's strategic planning and reporting cycle as part of an ongoing improvement journey. We are supporting each school to build and sustain high-quality evaluation as part of their planning for improvement. Consideration of a school within its wider network and community is woven throughout Te Ara Huarau, which will also identify opportunities where evaluations can occur at a community level.

Matariki Celebrations: On my return from Dargaville, I walked into the classrooms to find the tuakana-teina approach to learning being demonstrated as our students were working on their Matariki star mobiles. The older students were supporting the younger students to complete their works of art. It is pleasing to see the development in this i.e. the older students are no longer doing the mahi/work for the younger students, but supporting them while they do their own mahi / work. The questioning of the older students has improved over time, and watching the relationships develop makes us proud.

This continued on Wednesday into our **Matariki Cultural Food Festival.** Thanks, must go to Mrs Pye for organising the event, and staff for jumping on board to make the
