You can use your lettuce for the quick and easy "Lettuce Pesto" recipe with tortilla chips - very popular with our students this week. Send in money and order for same day turn around.



LETTUCE PESTO

- 4 packed cups of lettuce (your choice of varieties, a mild flavour works well)
- ¹/₃ cup fresh parsley
- 3 cloves garlic
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese
- ½ cup pine nuts
- ½ tsp salt
- olive oil to desired consistency (1/4 to 1/2 cup)

Place lettuce, parsley, garlic, cheese and salt into food processor. Pulse and add olive oil slowly until desired consistency reached. Use as a spread, dip or great with pasta. Store in fridge up to 2 weeks.

TORTILLA CHIPS - Cut plain wraps into dip size triangles, brush with olive oil, salt and pepper and add any herbs / flavourings you like. Bake in hot pre-heated oven until golden and crisp.
