Pioneer Projects - Back in 1985, Mrs Margaret Hunter, a member of the Pakotai Branch of New Zealand Women's Institute, introduced Pioneer Projects to Year 8 Students at Pakotai and Parakao Schools. The concept was that the Year 8 students would pick a historical topic in their area to research and investigate to record some of the history of the Mangakahia Valley. At a later date the Pioneer Projects were begun at Mangakahia Area School as well.

These projects have recently been used as sources of information for the book "True Tales of the Mangakahia Valley." We are presently working with the projects we have, to have a copy of each project at The Northland Room at Whangarei Public Library as well as a copy of each at the Mangakahia School Community Library. This will ensure that the history that is recorded is safely stored and available to those who might be interested.

There was also a trophy for the annual winner of this project called The Pioneer Project Award. Does anyone know anything about where this trophy may be?

The committee who published the "True Tales of Mangakahia Valley" book decided that we should make the offer to the authors of the projects, the Year 8 students, to get a copy of their project.
